Through planned modular SDG activities, we hope to enrich our students' English learning experiences and broaden their perspectives of how our actions today can impact the future.

Making a difference, one step at a time



To start, we've been engaging in meaningful planning with our collaborators and partner NGO organizations to strengthen our collective commitment with programs that will be most effective and efficient for our students and staff. Some of these programs are:

- Understanding refugee challenges: Encouraging effective ways to support refugees through volunteering and thoughtful contributions.
- Exploring the Malaysian rainforest and learning about environmental impact: Meeting with Malaysian indigenous communities and considering about environmental issues.
- Recycling adoption: Seeing how plastic pollution is tackled with 3-in-1 recycling machines converting ocean-bound plastic into reusable products.
- Practicing zero-waste management: Studying sustainable agriculture through the example of pineapple cultivation, maximizing every part of a crop from planting to harvest.
